### **KIWI VIEWING IN NOCTURNAL** HOUSES:

Please note that we have up to six kiwi on display in nocturnal houses at any one time at the Ōtorohanga Kiwi House. The light level in the nocturnal house is deliberately low to simulate moonlight for the kiwi. The human eye takes 5-15 minutes to adjust to the low light level before visitors can see clearly. This is particularly challenging for visitors as they age. Please ensure your clients are made aware of the light level before entering each nocturnal house so they can adjust their night vision and understand the environment they will be entering. Depending on the timeframe visitors are visiting in they may not always see a kiwi up close. If this becomes a difficulty during your group's tour please alert our staff to the issue and they will attempt to assist the group with seeing a kiwi. We can not guarantee that each visitor will be able to see a kiwi up close in the nocturnal house as sometimes kiwi remain in their burrows or forage at the back of their enclosures where they may be difficult to see. The longer visitors spend on site the higher their chances are of seeing kiwi up close. We do have burrow cameras set up so if the kiwi is inside its nestbox they can be viewed on the large digital screens at the entrance to the enclosures.
